### Investment strategy

The opportunity to invest in a diversified share portfolio of companies predominately listed on the ASX and selected on the basis of their social, environmental and financial credentials. The Fund utilises an active stock-picking management style with stocks generally selected for growth rather than income, with a bias towards smaller capitalisation stocks listed on the ASX. All stocks are chosen on the basis of relative value where we deem the risks are being adequately priced.



## Commentary

Global markets had a strong final quarter for 2022 after a volatile nine months, with the MSCI World index ex Australia rising 7.5% and the S&P ASX 300 rising 9.1%. Despite inflation remaining elevated, there were indications that prices could stabilize, as natural gas prices fell from a high of €340/MWh in August to pre-Ukraine levels near €70 by the end of the year. The US bond yield decreased dropping from 4.23% in October to 3.88% by the end of the year. The Australian bond market was more volatile, falling from 4.2% in October to 3.29% in December before finishing the year at 4.05%.

The Australian Shares Fund appreciated by 3.3% (Wholesale 3.5%) over the December quarter relative to its S&P/ASX300 Benchmark which appreciated 9.1% resulting in an underperformance of -5.8% (Wholesale -5.7%). The underperformance is attributed to both the Fund being overweight small companies which underperformed the broader market and our small company stock selection being a drag on performance this quarter. The underperformance can be primarily attributed to stock selection in Communications, Healthcare and Information Technology sectors. Companies like wealth management software company Bravura Solutions came clean on their 1st half 2023 trading in November while pathology and radiology company Healius downgraded earnings in November on higher cost structures with falling covid revenues, while cloud communications company Symbio downgraded profitability late in December. We view these as temporary setbacks which in time can be recovered. Performance was also impacted by substantial underweight positions in Materials (mainly resource stocks) and Energy which outperformed as commodity and oil prices increased.
